Finished size is 18" x 9"

You need:

- 1 FQ green for the grass
- 1 FQ or scraps in blue for the Danube
- 1 FQ or scraps in grey for the rats,
- 1 FQ or scraps in tan for the flute
- 11 small buttons
- 1 medium button

Directions:

Fute

1. Take the C and the H squares. Draw a diagonal line. Place the square in the corner on the rectangle and sew on the line. Leave a ¼" seam allowance and cut the corner. Repeat this on the other side.
2. Take the B rectangle and 2 H squares. Draw a diagonal line. Place the square in the corner on the rectangle and sew on the line. Leave a ¼" seam allowance and cut the corner away. Repeat this on the other side.

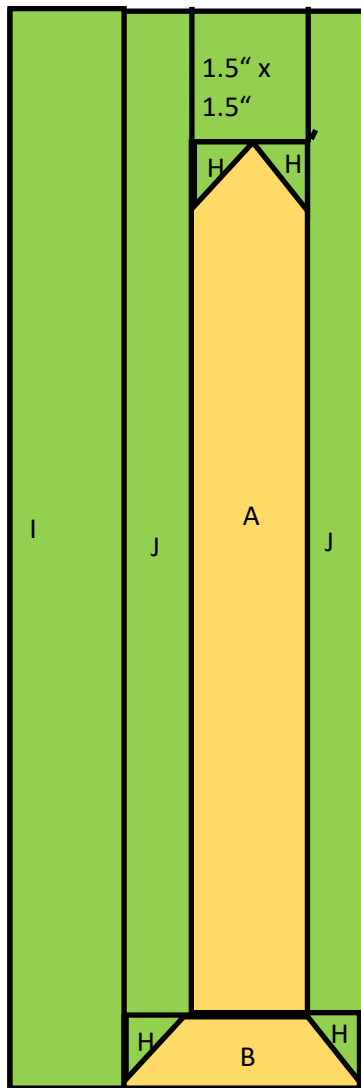
Rats

3. Take a gray and a green D square. Draw a diagonal line on a square on the back. Lay the squares on top of each other and sew with a ¼" spacing left and right of the line. Cut the square on the line. Fold the pieces apart. Trip parts to 2.5" x 2.5".
4. Take a gray E rectangle and a G square. Draw a diagonal line on the back of the G square. Place the square in the upper right corner. Sew on the line. Leave a ¼" seam allowance and cut the corner.
5. Repeat point 4 2-times.

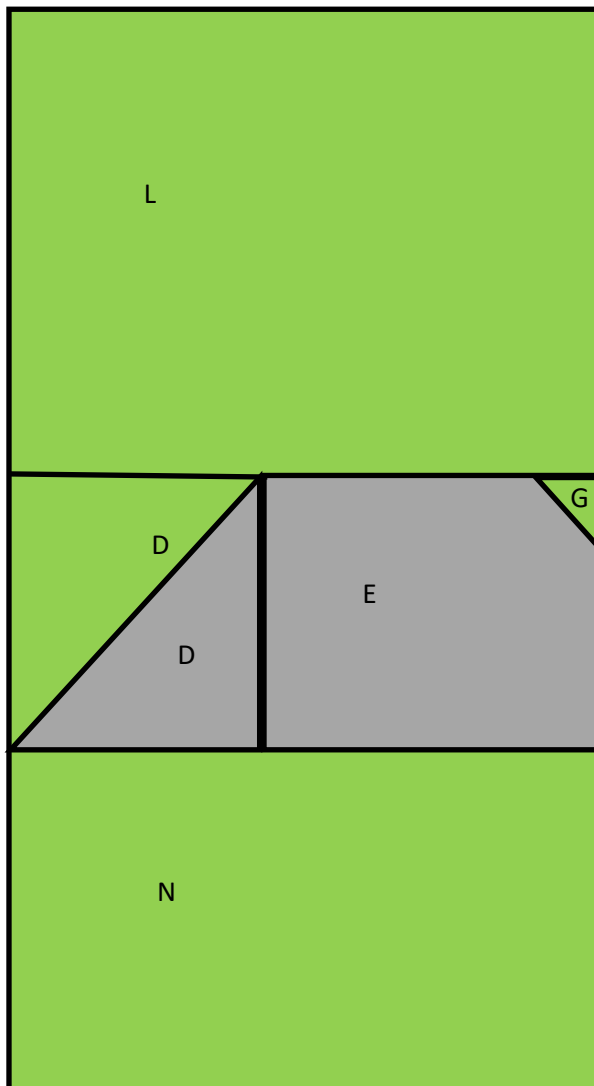
6. Take a F rectangle and a H square. Draw a diagonal line on the back of the green square. Place the spare on the the corner. Sew on the line. Leave a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance and cut the corner.
7. Repeat points 6 2-times.

Assembly

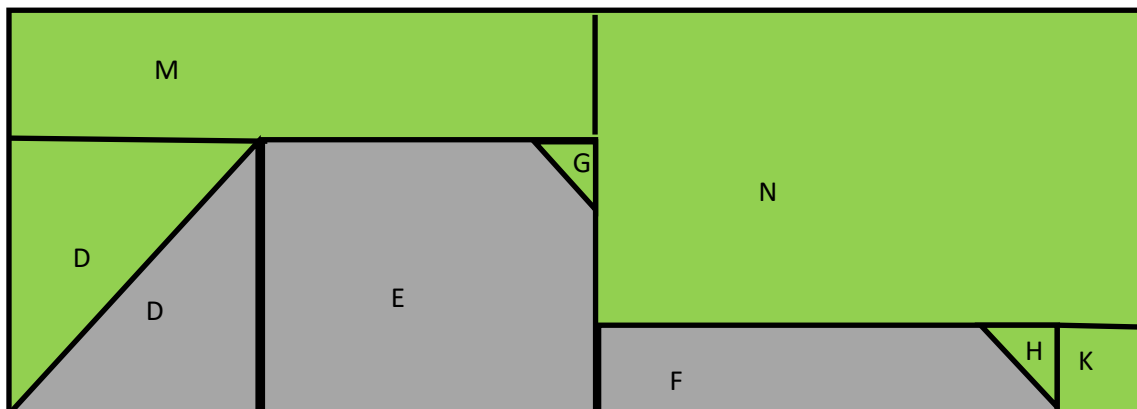
8. Use the graphic to help and sew the parts of the flute together.



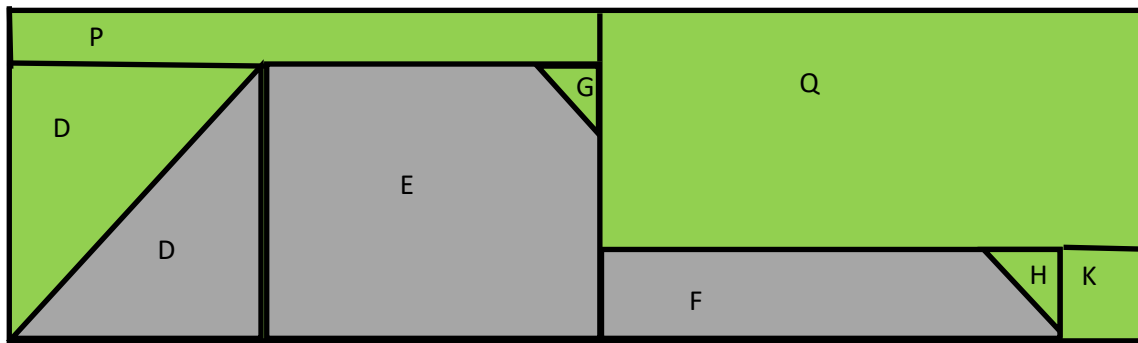
9. Use the graphic to help and sew the parts of the first rat together.



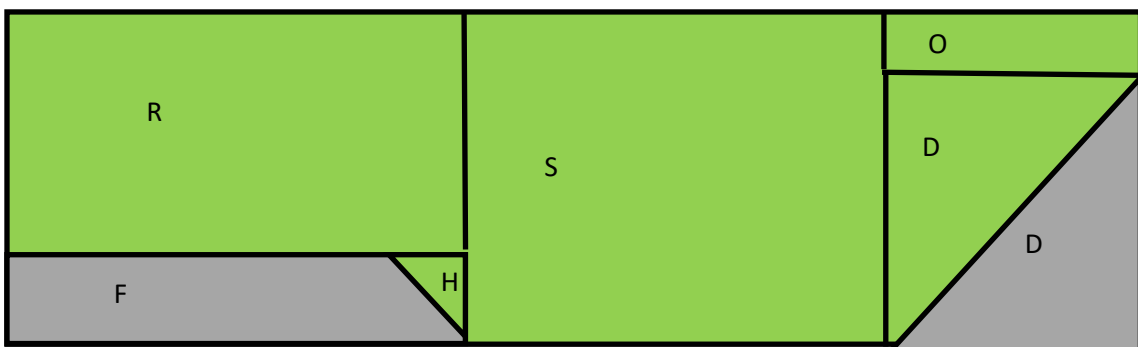
10. Use the graphic as help and sew the parts of the top rat.



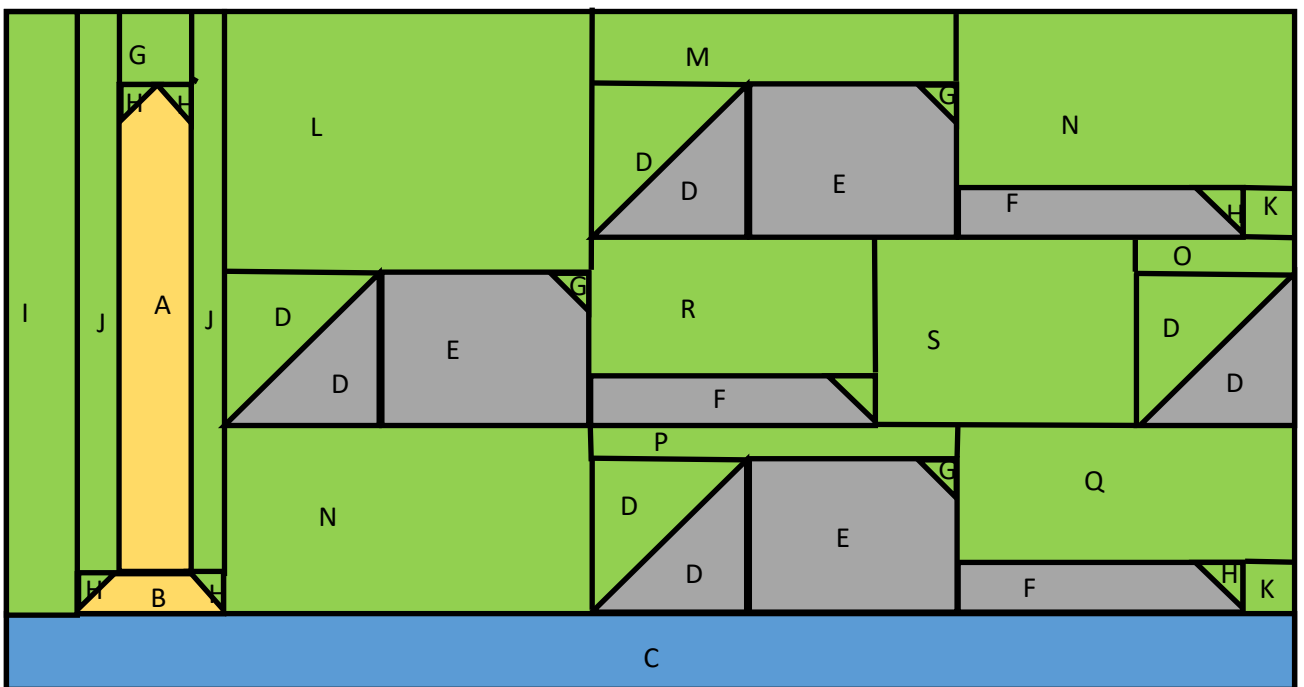
11. Use the graphic as help and sew the parts of the parts of the bottom rat.



12. Use the graphic as help and sew the parts of the rats in the middle.



13. Assemble all parts.



14. Take the buttons and sew them as eyes for the rats and holes on the flute.
